Guidelines for Internships

- The internship should advance the student's knowledge of a career path or professional field that she is considering.
- The position's responsibilities may include some routine clerical work, but it should not be primarily a clerical position.
- The student is given academic credit based upon the number of hours of experience gained at the internship. In applying, the student has agreed to complete a set number of hours. Please maintain a record of the student's completed hours at the internship.
- The internship site must have a supervisor who will agree to mentor and evaluate the student. Mentorship includes reviewing the student's goals for the internship at the outset of the internship; offering insights into concepts, strategies, and methods; and guiding the student toward research materials that will enhance his/her knowledge of the field.
- For academic credit, students are required to complete a written summary of their work or a research paper. They are asked to explore with the site supervisor whether they can devise a research project that would benefit the employer while fulfilling the academic requirement.
